The Veterans and Military Families Caucus supports your legislation **HB 163 - Rural Health Care Tax Credit Eligibility**.

Expansion of rural health care resources in New Mexico is a critical issue for veterans and military families all over the state.

The 2023 Veterans Profile states that there were **139,347 veterans living in New Mexico as of 2021**. Veterans represented **8.6 percent of the civilian population 18 and older** in our state. Add to that the number of active duty military families in our state, National Guard families, and retired military and veteran family members that also may need access to treatment.

Rural residents face serious challenges with access to health care. An estimated 15 to 20 percent of the US population live in rural areas. An average **8.7% of veterans live in New Mexico's rural areas**. Encouraging medical professionals to serve in rural areas by giving a tax credit will help address the current inadequate access to health care.

The VMFC Caucus has supported health care expansion in the past few years and will continue to do so. Please **share this letter of support with your colleagues** in committees as you advance the legislation.
